Why Accreditation Matters

Accreditation assures the public, students and government agencies that the institution meets established standards. It allows access to federal funding and supports the value and credibility of an institution's degree. Accreditation:

- Ensures the continuation of the SDSU degree.
- Determines eligibility for federal funding.
- Demonstrates that the institution is committed to accountability and continuous improvement, and truthfully and clearly represents its academic goals, programs, requirements, services and costs.
- Provides students, parents and the general community assurances that SDSU meets the rigorous standards for accreditation.
